FROM THE MINISTER'S ROLLTOP:

“Shall We Start Having Two Sunday Services?”

At our 25th Anniversary Celebration Service on September 8th, if the children had not been seated on the floor up front with me, there would not have been nearly enough seats for everyone in attendance. With the significant increase in members and visitors we've had of late, people who have come in at the last minute have found it difficult to find a place to sit.

It's a nice problem to have, especially since we've seen a significant increase in young parents with children in recent months. One Sunday in September we had a record 4 infants and toddlers in the nursery.

It is a problem that also confronts us with some significant challenges. We want to be hospitable, but people who find us too crowded will be less likely to appreciate what we have to offer or desire to return. As consultant Larry Wheeler told us the year before last, when our sanctuary starts to reach an 80% occupancy rate, so the research shows, we will start losing return visits by people. Our occupancy is typically over 80% of available seating on most Sunday mornings.

How do we address this problem? We can't afford to buy and move to a larger space. We do not have the financial resources available to significantly expand our sanctuary nor do we have the parking spaces available that would enable us to get a permit to engage in such an expansion.

So, for the time being, it seems we will have to make do with what we have. But we have taken some easy actions to bridge the gap:

*We've purchased 10 additional chairs to put in the sanctuary which will increase our seating capacity to 160. This number probably reflects the level of occupancy we can achieve without sacrificing remaining space necessary to ensure safety and accessibility.

*We've asked our Ushers to politely escort people to available seats as the Sanctuary becomes full.

Unfortunately, neither of these measures will fully resolve the problem. So we will have to think seriously and creatively about how we will use the space available to us.

A "solution" many members have been voicing lately has been that of going to two Sunday services. In response, I have also heard some of our most dedicated members and friends rejecting this option for a variety of reasons, some of them good.

It has become apparent that a decision to go to two services cannot be made quickly or easily. At the last meeting of Summit's Board of Directors I recommended that a Task Force be established to 1) study the pros and cons of having two services and 2) to develop a proposal based on its findings for the congregation to consider.

Shall we go to two services? What do you think?...And stay tuned for what is certain to be more energetic discussions around this issue. As for me, I am certain we can accomplish whatever we set our minds, hearts and hands to doing.
