February 5 "Lovers of Leaving" Rev. Tania Marquez, Guest Minister

Rev Tania explores the meaning of the phrase "Lovers of Leaving" from Rumi's poem "Come, Come, Wherever You Are." It is an exploration of the journey of seekers and their encounter with the Devine.

Rev. Tania is a hospital chaplain, and is also providing pastoral care for Summitarians this year.

February 12 "Where There is Love" Grace Lewis-McLaren, Guest Speaker

A few stories, a couple of poetic parables, some life lessons learned...and perhaps a few wisdoms shared in under 20 minutes: that's the jist of the reflection for this Sunday.

Grace is perhaps best known to the Summit folks as Mary Carter-Vail's mom. As you've learned from many of Mary's stories, her roots are in the state of Maine. Grace is also a retired organist and composer who spends the winter months here in California.

Summit's search for a new full-time minister continues apace. Our posting on the UUA Ministerial Search Jobs Board went on-line in early December, and we soon began receiving applications from credentialed UU ministers. We have received four credentialed applications through the UUA portal, but one subsequently withdrew. Additionally, we have received one "non-traditional" letter of interest.

After reviewing all these applications, we have completed Zoom interviews with our top candidates. The results of these interviews are very encouraging, and we are optimistic we will be able to fill our vacancy with an outstanding candidate. Summit is known as an open, caring community without a lot of "baggage." All of the candidates commented particularly on the quality of our RE program as a reason they are interested in us. Being in San Diego, doesn't hurt either!

In February we expect to do some follow-up interviews and due diligence research. Also, we understand that additional applications might come in March from newly-credentialed candidates. We hope to be able to recommend our top choice to Summit's Board by the end of March.

We are sad to report that two of our Committee members have resigned, citing other obligations. We will miss working with Brian Reardon and Lara Barrett, both of whom made outstanding contributions to the work we've been doing.

Welcome to the month of Love at Summit. We will be sharing our love for one another and for our community this month as we engage with the theme of Love. How each of us experience and share love is uniquely beautiful and wonderous. May each of us be blessed with experiences that express love month.

Love: There are many paths of love that each of us experience throughout our lives: the love of a caregiver, the love of a best friend, love for a pet, your first love, love of a hobby, of learning and so much more. As part of my job, I regularly witness the love shared by the many families who are part of this community. Sometimes it is hard to quantify or measure the love that is expressed in community. I witness love in action each week as the many volunteers create our Sunday services, events like our auction, and so much more. For the past 11 years, our children and youth have made cards of care to send to folks who are part of the Summit family. Our February Theme is: Love

We will then engage in our CRE activities in the RE area and/or outside (depending on weather conditions). We have a special snack provided by one of our families after our exploration time that we share outside under the shade canopy until we are finished at 11:30 am.

February 5 – Love for Self – We will begin our month of exploring love with ourselves. How do we love ourselves? We will share a beautiful story about seeing our selves reflected in others before creating a valentine celebrating what we love about who we are. We will begin to make cards for all of our Summit friends and family as we start our annual Valentines Cards of Care project.

February 12 – Love for Family and Friends: Making Valentine's— How do you experience love in your family? We will be sharing all the ways we experience love in our family and with friends and we will continue creating cards for the 12th annual Cards of Care project for Summit friends and members.

February 19 – Love for Community – We will share a story about how neighbors shared love by creating community together. We will then share our love for the community here by caring for our garden together as we grow food to share.

We thank you for your care. 💌




ADULT LIFE ENRICHMENT—AFFINITY GROUPS

Article II Commission has been assigned the task of re-evaluating and re-forming our guiding principles. Here is their draft—in a nutshell. It will be voted on at General Assembly, in June.



Interdependence. We honor the interdependent web of all existence. We covenant to cherish Earth and all beings by creating and nurturing relationships of care and respect. With humility and reverence, we acknowledge our place in the great web of life, and we work to repair harm and damaged relationships.

Pluralism. We celebrate that we are all sacred beings diverse in culture, experience, and theology. We covenant to learn from one another in our free and responsible search for truth and meaning. We embrace our differences and commonalities with Love, curiosity, and respect.

Justice. We work to be diverse multicultural Beloved Communities where all thrive. We covenant to dismantle racism and all forms of systemic oppression. We support the use of inclusive democratic processes to make decisions.



Transformation. We adapt to the changing world. We covenant to collectively transform and grow spiritually and ethically. Openness to change is fundamental to our Unitarian and Universalist heritages, never complete and never perfect.

Generosity. We cultivate a spirit of gratitude and hope. We covenant to freely and compassionately share our faith, presence, and resources. Our generosity connects us to one another in relationships of interdependence and mutuality.

Equity. We declare that every person has the right to flourish with inherent dignity and worthiness. We covenant to use our time, wisdom, attention, and money to build and sustain fully accessible and inclusive communities.
