Finally, September 24th will be the first in a series of once-monthly sermons about Liberation Theology, best defined as an approach to theology centered around the liberation of oppressed people (but it's more complex than that). Knowing Summit to be a fellowship with an activist's heart, I can't wait to explore these theologies alongside you.

Until then, I'm waiting to start meeting you all with bated breath!

RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION NEWS

MARY CARTER-VAIL, DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

Welcome to the beginning of a new Religious Exploration curriculum year! September is when we start our year as we

match the time when children transition to new grade levels at school. This year is extra exciting as we have our new minister, KC Marie Pandell, joining us and she is already getting to know our families. We will also be splitting into two or three age-centered groups for the first time since we went virtual in 2020. There is much to be excited about and it all begins with our theme for the month so welcome to September at Summit.

The Gift of Welcome: We are beginning our new year partnering with Soul Matters Sharing Circle once again. This year the themes and curriculum are going to explore the new draft of the second article that is in the process of being adopted by the UUA. (For more information visit: <https://www.uua.org/uuagovernance/committees/article-ii-study-commission>.) We start with *The Gift of Welcome*. One of the things that I love about Unitarian Universalism is that we aspire to welcome all. Does this mean that all will feel welcomed? Maybe not. I have heard it said that UU's welcome "all who welcome all". And that really is the goal. So, this month we will be centering the gift of welcoming and how we welcome and include all. When it comes to children, youth and families, what does that look like? Children can be wiggly and noisy and for some, that can feel out of place in a traditional protestant worship service. I ask, what is worship but the celebration of life and community? And the heart of any living community is the children of that community. As long as we have giggling, giggling, noises and babbles of the babes, we are a living and growing Fellowship. When you feel challenged by the sounds of life, lean into *the gift of welcome* and challenge yourself to the spiritual practice of welcoming all.

Soul Work: As we explore ways of welcoming all our families have been asking for more ways of

including people of all ages in the worship space. Children and adults can be wiggly and having something to hold, or create with, as a form of worship participation is a kind of spiritual practice. On the first Sunday of the month, our children will be preparing the items for the Soul Work space. Mary will be sharing more about how we will be using Soul Work at a Time for All Ages during the month. We hope that this is something that all ages can enjoy.

FAITH FORMATION vs RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION: You may have heard me use the term **Faith Formation**. This is becoming more commonly used term in UU spaces as the word "religious" has loaded meaning for many. As UU's, our faith is one of covenant with each other. So, the term Faith Formation is about learning to live in covenant with our values and each other. This is what we practice in religious exploration through story, games, activities, conversation and more. Our children, youth and adults are learning and forming their faith through the practice of doing, playing and discovering faith while being together in covenant each time we gather and with each experience we take home. I am playing with this language as we explore the second article themes this year as it feels more authentic to what we are creating now.

Age-Centered Groups for Faith Formation: For the past two years, since we have returned to an in person, hybrid, post pandemic gathering, our Religious Exploration program has operated as "One Room School House" format with children, youth and families all together for story and activities. Now it is time for us to return to age-centered groups as our children are ready to be more independent and Parents/Caregivers are excited to be more involved with the congregation. This allows for our children and youth to have more age-centered experiences in their groups and offers more opportunities for adults other than parents to get involved as mentors with our incredible kids.

FAITH FORMATION VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

As our new year begins, we are once again creating a classroom style experience with volunteers who will be Faith Formation Leaders that guide our children and youth as they explore throughout the year. Each group needs two leaders on a Sunday to support them with a story and activities which Mary will prepare in advance. Currently, we need more volunteers so that folks will only need to help one Sunday a month. All our parents volunteer as well as many young adults who grew up at Summit. It is special when we have adults who are not parents of children in the program share their time with our kids. In the past, we have had up to 45 volunteers each month with ages ranging from 18 to 98! All that has changed since the pandemic, and we are currently rebuilding the program. Please consider being part of this important part of our congregational life. (Volunteers who work with children will need to be background checks and take a Mandated Reporter training.) Our September Theme is The Gift of Welcome.

We will be gathering in RE at 10 am on Sundays for Religious Exploration. Our children and youth will participate in the service until after the “Time for All Ages” story. We will then split into age-centered groups to engage in our activities in the Religious Exploration area and/or outside (depending on weather conditions). After the service, we will be joining our families in the Salon for sustenance & community social time. Nursery childcare will be available until 12 noon.

September 3 – Getting Ready to Share the Gift of Welcome – Our new minister joins us next Sunday for the first time! This week we will be getting ready to welcome her by creating some welcome

signs and decorations for the Salon. We will also be creating welcome packets for new children who visit and items for our new Soul Work table to be added to the Sanctuary next week. Join us as we get ready to share the *Gift of Welcome!*

September 10 – Welcome Sunday! – This is the first Sunday of our RE year and our first service with our new minister, KC Marie Pandell, in the pulpit. Our children will be joining the congregation for the first part of the service as we get to know KC. We will then head back to the RE area to work on a “wider welcome” as we play some games, create a covenant and prepare some welcome snacks to share in the Salon after the service.

September 17 – Welcoming Our Many Sources of Nourishment – Water Communion: A Full Fellowship Sunday Service – For the first time in several years we will be gathering for a water communion service. This service for all ages will include a ritual where we all bring water from home or a place of meaning to blend as a sacred community practice. All ages are together for this service. Nursery childcare will be available.

September 24 – Welcoming the Work of Apology & Forgiveness – “Sorry” can feel like the hardest words to say. This week we are going to explore, thru games and roll play, ways to take responsibility for “oops” and “ouch” moments by practicing the work of apology and forgiveness. This can be very powerful for all ages and is a practice that has lifelong impact.

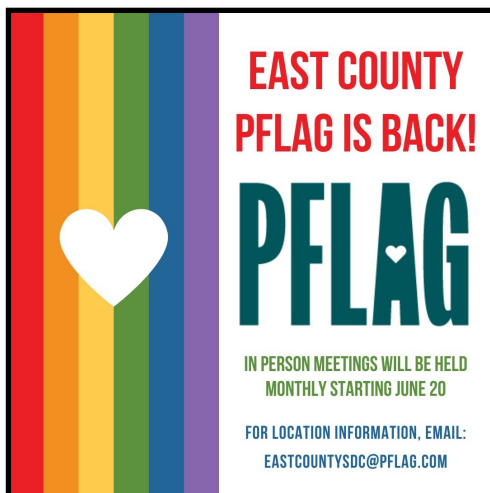
Drinks and croissant sandwiches will be served. Childcare will be available for families that wish to attend.

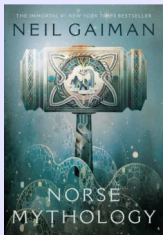
