Dear Members, Friends, and Staff of Summit:

The Board and I are anxious to grow our community – to reach out to the many people in East County that are looking for a spiritual home that embraces diversity. Doing so is a multifaceted process that requires the work of many committees and individuals. Over the next year, we will see an expanded social media presence, updates to the website, new adult RE offerings, and a revitalized music program. We will be reaching out to members, visitors, folks we haven't seen in a while, and neighbors we have not yet met.

KC has been our minister for 9 months now. She has served us very well and, even though we do not have the money to pay her what she fully deserves, she has led our congregation with enthusiasm and love. As we adjust to KC's style and she adjusts to ours, I recommend that we all remain open to change, take a deep breath, and share any desires and concerns with KC with kindness and an open mind. KC is helping us grow as a congregation. Growth and change are hard but necessary if we are to become a more vibrant and diverse community.

MARY CARTER-VAIL, DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

We are growing and grooving in our religious exploration program. We had new families joining our Sunday program and

we have begun our upper elementary OWL program with several new to Summit families. We celebrated Interdependence last month and our garden was the focus, and it is growing along with our children. This month we have a new theme to explore: Pluralism. Let's get started!

The Gift of Pluralism: Our new theme is inspired by the Article II values that we continue to explore this year. Article II defines Pluralism as follows:

"Pluralism: We celebrate that we are all sacred beings, diverse in culture, experience, and theology. We covenant to learn from one another in our free and responsible search for truth and meaning. We embrace our differences and commonalities with Love, curiosity, and respect."

Please note that these are big concepts for our youngest children so we will be exploring them in age-appropriate ways. We will start by creating our own understanding of these values and then dive a bit deeper as we work towards the promise of a Beloved Community.

This month we will be exploring Pluralism or the gifts that we share as we "search for what is true" for each of us. What does that look like for children and families? It is learning from each other and discovering through play and experience. This month we are having our first Game Night so that we can play together, and we will have an RE lunch at the end of the month that all are welcome to be part of. Gathering with all ages is a way that our youngest Summitarians can learn and grow in community. Let us play and learn from each other as we explore pluralism this month.

Soul Work: Our Soul Work Table has new content this month with the theme of Plurality. There will

be weaving as we explore the weaving of ideas together that is part of plurality. The stained-glass coloring pages and embroidery hoops are still available as well. Take something to your seat as you listen to the service. The Soul Work Table and Cozy Corner are for all ages so please enjoy!

OWL – Our Whole Lives for Upper Elementary has started! It is very exciting to have upper elementary OWL happening here at Summit for the next two months. Our 4th, 5th and 6th grade participants and their families, some of which are new to Summit, are learning about what to expect as they begin the journey of growing up.

Join us for All Ages Faith Formation at Summit:

We are growing our Religious Exploration program and expanding to an all-ages Faith Formation program. Join us and consider being part of this important part of our congregational life. (Volunteers who work with children will need to be background checked and take Mandated Reporter training.) Contact Mary at summitdre@gmail.com to explore ways you can be part of Faith Formation at Summit.

Our May Theme is The Gift of Pluralism:

We will be gathering in RE at 10 am on Sundays for Religious Exploration activities. Our children and youth will participate in the service until after the "Time for All Ages" story. We will then split into age centered groups to engage in our activities in the Religious Exploration area and/or outside (depending on weather conditions). After the service, we will be joining our families in the Salon for sustenance & community social time. Nursery childcare will be available until 12 noon.

May 5 – Many Views: "We Need Each Other to Perceive The Whole!" In this session, we begin to explore pluralism, exploring how each of us may see something different even while looking at the same thing. We will then create some art as we share our different ways of seeing and how each of our ideas is part of the whole. May 12 - Many Sources: "We Are Made of Many Roots!" The many sources of the UU faith will be our focus this week as we explore them in story as the roots of our faith tree. Then we will each make our own tree and play with the values that are at our roots.

May 18 – GAME NIGHT for All Ages at Summit: 5 pm Potluck Dinner & 6 pm Games. All are invited to enjoy a meal and play games on this Saturday evening. Bring family and friends as this is a great way to get to know Summit and build connections. Family friendly games are welcome. May 19 – Many People: "No One Gets Left Out!" We will be exploring welcoming through games that include and talking about what it's like to be left out as a way to build our empathy muscles. Reverse musical chairs anyone?

May 26 – Many Things to Celebrate Plus RE Lunch together: This Sunday we will be preparing for our RE lunch by making a salad from our garden and celebrating the many things we have discovered

together this year as we begin to plan our RE Service for June 9th. After the service, we will share lunch with the community, and celebrate the pluralism by being together.


> SOCIAL JUSTICE IN ACTION <



GENERAL ASSEMBLY REGISTRATION IS OPEN LOVE UNITES, STORIES IGNITE

In a world filled with division and challenges, the theme for this year's General Assembly is a powerful reminder of the core principles that unite us as Unitarian Universalists. "Love Unites, Stories Ignite" celebrates the profound impact of love as a binding force that transcends boundaries and fosters connections within our faith community and beyond.

Our faith has always been rooted in the power of storytelling, and this year we'll explore how our stories can ignite change, inspire compassion, and help us build a more just and equitable world. Through storytelling, we share our experiences, our dreams, our struggles, and our triumphs. It is through these stories that we can find common ground, deepening our understanding of one another and the world around us.

The 63rd General Assembly will take place virtually Thursday, June 20 through Sunday, June 23, 2024. Registration is open – through May 15 it is \$315 and provides access to over a hundred workshops, special lectures, worship services, and (new) cohort groups – over a dozen groups where you can virtually gather with others interested in similar areas of congregational life.
