A MESSAGE FROM OUR SUMMER PASTORAL CARE MINISTER

Dear Summitarians —

Hello! My name is Rev. Everett Howe (he/him), and those of you who were members or friends between 2020 and 2022 will remember me as Summit's half-time minister during those years. I am grateful to be able to serve Summit again in a new way this summer, as your pastoral care minister while Pastor KC is away.

I will be working as an hourly employee as needed. Pastor KC and I agreed that rather than having specific "office hours," I will instead be available for pastoral calls throughout the week and weekend, with the understanding that I may not be able to respond immediately. My goal is that if you contact me in the morning or early afternoon I will call or write back by the evening, and that if you contact me in the evening or night I will respond by the following morning. The only exception is the week of June 29 through July 6, when I will be working as camp chaplain at de Benneville Pines and will have limited availability (and limited cell service). If you contact me during that week, I will do my best, but I might not be able to respond until after I return.

I am looking forward to connecting with you!

For those who don't know me, or who would

like an update on what I've been doing, here's a little background information. I'm a 59-year-old white man, married and with two grown



children, who has lived in San Diego since 1996. My first career was as a research mathematician, and even though I am no longer employed in that field, I still spend about 20 hours per week doing mathematical research as an independent scholar. I graduated from Starr King School for the Ministry in 2019 and was ordained by the First UU Church of San Diego in May 2020; currently I am an affiliated community minister at First UU. I started my work at Summit in July 2020 and helped lead the fellowship through the first two years of the COVID pandemic.

This summer I will be continuing my part-time work for the UUA as the <u>WorshipWeb</u> assistant, working as camp chaplain for elementary camp as I mentioned above, providing summer pastoral coverage for the UU Fellowship of San Dieguito as well as for Summit, and preaching at several congregations in Southern California, including Summit on August 4.

New Pronoun Stickers for Nametags

This is to let the Fellowship know that the Welcoming and Membership Committee has some new pronoun stickers for your name tag if you already don't have one. They are nice and colorful, so make sure you get yours.

Pronouns, like personal names, are connected to a person's identity. Just as we can show respect by calling others by their correct name(s), we can show respect by using the correct pronouns. Using the wrong pronoun can make a person uncomfortable and possibly invalidated or alienated.

Many of us were taught as children that we are supposed to assume other people's pronouns, usually based on additional assumptions about that person's gender. However, the practice of assuming another person's pronouns, as well as assuming another person's gender, does not honor that person's identity and experience.

As we seek to be a welcoming congregation, especially to transgender and gender-nonconforming people, a recent topic is gender pronouns. A person's name or physical appearance do not necessarily indicate their gender so we should not make gender assumptions based on these.

So, let's continue to be a welcoming Fellowship and make sure you stop by the visitors table to get yours as part of this process!

San Diego Pride Parade: Saturday, July, 20th: Parade Begins at 10 AM

The parade begins at the Hillcrest Pride Flag at University Ave. and Normal St., proceeds west on University Ave., turns south on 6th Ave., turns left onto Balboa Dr. and ends at Quince Drive. The parade officially kicks off at 10 AM, but you will need to arrive earlier to be a participant in



the UU entry. The gathering time and location will be announced after July 4th and will be advertised in the Summit eNews. Note: Parking will be difficult. Plan on carpooling or utilizing public transportation.

This year, the UU Cluster will decorate a truck filled with haystacks and benches to allow some of our members and friends to sit while being part of the Unitarian Universalist Pride Parade contingent. Summit members and friends have been known to participate in Parasol Drill teams and wear wacky costumes in the past! Come dressed in your most colorful glam, bring your walking shoes, wear your hats, bring drinks for hydration, sunscreen to shield your skin, and come equipped with your smiles and hearts!
