
November 17 "Planting Seeds" Stephanie Mood, Guest Speaker

Dear Summitarians and Friends:

At the time of this

writing, we are in a unique space: I have been blessed by two congregations, one of which being this beautiful community, and have had the joyful pleasure to have the title "Reverend" bestowed on me, after 8 years of hard work towards that moment. That moment that came less than 14 days before an election that will forever change the face of this country. An election that has anxiety running rampant amongst our relationships, community, and the country at large (and, arguably: the world). Since that moment, we have heard continued racist rhetoric said loudly and proudly from political rallies, as well as calls for hope and community in other rallies.

We know that the next few days will be difficult, and no matter the outcome on Nov. 5, there will be big emotions to be tended to, and plenty of relationships that may require attention and repair.

But I'm not in the business of fear mongering, I'm in the business of hopeful dreaming, dreaming a better future with all of you, a more just, liberative, and loving future, and I will continue to do that at every turn. That is what this faith calls us to do, and I do so with pride.

In the spirit of hopefulness, a few notes on the month of November: this upcoming Sunday (Nov. 3), we will be hosting a mini-ordination at Summit, for those of us who were unable to attend the service in person. The Zoom recording is available for anyone interested. On November 24, not only are we hosting a Bread Communion (please bring bread to share!), but immediately after service, we will be decking the halls together, and dressing up our lovely Sanctuary for the holiday season ahead. I hope

I won't pretend the upcoming days are easy: it's been remarkably difficult to plan even sermons for the month, when there are so many unknowns, so many uncertainties. At the end of it all, though, we have each other. May we hold each other kindly in the pain, firmly in the uncertain, and always with love at every opportunity. These days, perhaps especially, I am always available to share my heart space with you. I love you all, and we will navigate this next moment in history together.

LIFESPAN FAITH FORMATION NEWS Mary Carter-Vail, Director of Religious Exploration

My heart is still singing as I write this. We had the great honor of Ordaining our minister— Pastor KC is now Reverend KC Marie Pandell. Some of us

attended the in-person service and ritual and some attended online. Many more will be here on the first Sunday in November when we will participate in a ritual at Summit for the full fellowship. It is our community that honors our new minister as she honors us by choosing us as we choose her. I hope that your hearts are singing as well.

Repair: Our theme for this month is the <u>Practice of</u> <u>Repair</u>. This is an opportunity to repair relationships, grow connections and to heal hurts by being in our community together. A major goal this month is to help our children understand the many tools we have available to heal each other and the world. We also hope to impress on our children that these ways of going about repair matter, regardless of how supposedly "large" or "small" they may be. We will be focusing on three areas to practice repair: Democracy, Kindness and Honesty. We will then conclude the month with Gratitude at our first Bread Communion service.

Soul Work: Our Soul Work table will continue to be part of the cozy corner in the Sanctuary. We are working on new ideas to add to the table this fall. If you have an idea to share, let Mary know so we can expand some of the activities on the table. Meanwhile, there is always something available to work with during the service. Take something to your seat as you listen to the service. The Soul Work Table and Cozy Corner are for all ages so please enjoy!

RE Community Gatherings: Deck the Summit Halls – **Sunday, Nov 24**: Following the service at 11:30am in the Sanctuary. All ages are welcome as we get our festive decorating on. Bring some cookies to share for our special decorating social hour following the service. Decorations and evergreens donations welcome.

Join us for All Ages Faith Formation at Summit: VOLUNTEERS NEEDED! We are growing our Religious Exploration program and expanding to an all-ages Faith Formation program. Join us and consider being part of this important part of our congregational life. (Volunteers who work with children will need to be background checked and take Mandated Reporter training.) Our November Theme is the Practice of Repair:

We will be gathering in RE at 10am on Sundays for our Religious Exploration activities. Our children and youth will participate in the service until after the "Time for All Ages" story. We will then split into age centered groups to engage in our activities in the Religious Exploration area and/or outside (depending on weather conditions). After the service, we will be joining our families in the Salon for sustenance & community social time. Nursery childcare will be available until 12 noon.

November 3 – Democracy (The Tool to Repair Not Having a Say) – What is repair? Get out your UU toolbox as we begin to explore the tools of repair starting with the importance of the right to Vote. As part of this Sunday, we hope to be able to go visit the polling place on site at Summit. We will also have a special creative project to work on.

November 10 – Kindness (The Tool to Repair Meanness) – In this session we will explore the power of kindness as a way to repair a difficult experience. How do you experience kindness and how do you share it? We will be learning the art of repair by sewing and repairing with thread as we talk about the thread of kindness that we have the opportunity to weave each day.

November 17 – Rev KC & Honesty (The Tool to Repair Lies) – Reverand KC will be joining us this Sunday in RE as we explore honesty and begin to plan our RE Holiday service for Dec 15. This will be a very special day for our children and youth to build a connection with KC and create a space for conversations around the importance of honesty in families and beyond.

➢ SOCIAL JUSTICE IN ACTION ↔

Did you know that Summit supports microloans to small businesses worldwide through an organization called Kiva? This group "uses crowdfunded microloans as a force for good, creating a space where people can have one-to-one impact, and together, expand financial access for all."

Currently Summit has about \$150 distributed in loans. Once paid back, we redistribute the funds, usually to women-run vegetarian enterprises. If you would like to support this effort, donations are accepted through the Social Justice in Action link at https://summituuf.breezechms.com/give/online . You can designate your donation for Kiva.

Here is some information on our latest loan recipient, who lives in Fiji.

Maria's story

When her children left school because the family couldn't afford it, Maria decided she had to expand her fruit and vegetable stall. She makes about \$40 per day on top of her husband's wages as a carpenter. Maria will add bananas and other vegetables to her stock, and seeks a loan to finance this growth plan. From past experience, she believes the larger business can earn \$60 a day. She hopes this boost in income will allow her to send her children back to school.

This loan is facilitated by our Lending Partner, South Pacific Business Development (SPBD) - Fiji. Lending Partners are local organizations working in communities to vet borrowers, provide services, and administer loans on the ground.

This loan supports financially marginalized women in Fiji with credit to help them establish businesses and improve their livelihoods. SPBD Fiji provides financial literacy training to help borrowers better understand their income and expenses, and also offers market-specific guidance throughout the loan period. In Fiji, there are very few other microfinance institutions. By supporting this loan, you're helping empower women with the credit and education needed to start and grow their businesses.


MEN'S DISCUSSION GROUP #2
