LIFESPAN FAITH FORMATION NEWS Mary Carter-Vail, Director of Religious Exploration

Once again, we enter the season of darkness in the Northern Hemisphere. This is a time for reflection as our bodies want to hibernate for the cold

months. Our culture asks us to speed up and get busy with parties, traditions and gifts. This month we have a new theme to challenge this commercial business by engaging in the spiritual practice of Presence.

Presence: Our theme for this month is the *Practice* of *Presence*. What does it feel like to be fully present in a place? As you are reading this, take a moment to pause and arrive fully in the moment. Where are you? What are the smells, sounds and feels you are experiencing. Is there a taste in your mouth? Can you hear anything? Check in with your senses and take a minute to become fully present in the moment. Breath in and out and be present now.

The Spiritual Practice of Presence: How is this a powerful spiritual practice? We are always here, in the moment, are we not? Ask yourself, are you fully present right now or are you thinking about the last thing you did or the next thing that needs to happen? Our culture has us looking for what's next rather than being fully in appreciation of the current moment. This is the mindset of consumption, and of consumerism. The antidote is to value the moment we are in, down to the micro -second. Being in the moment is a gift to give yourself and to teach others. May you be blessed with this practice this season and beyond.

Soul Work: Our Soul Work table will continue to be part of the cozy corner in the Sanctuary. This month, make a snowflake or practice presence with mindful doodling during the service. If you have an idea to share, let Mary know so we can expand some of the activities on the table. Meanwhile, there is always something available to work with during the service. Take something to your seat as you listen to the service. The Soul Work Table and Cozy Corner are for all ages so please enjoy! Join us for All Ages Faith Formation at Summit: VOLUNTEERS NEEDED! We are growing our Religious Exploration program and expanding to an all-ages Faith Formation program. Join us and consider being part of this important part of our congregational life. (Volunteers who work with children will need to be background checked and take Mandated Reporter training.) Our December Theme is the Practice of Presence: We will be gathering in RE at 10 am on Sundays for Religious Exploration activities. Our children and youth will participate in the service until after the "Time for All Ages" story. We will then split into age centered groups to engage in our activities in the Religious Exploration area and/or outside (depending on weather conditions). After the service, we will be joining our families in the Salon for sustenance & community social time. Nursery childcare will be available until 12 noon.

December 1 – Presence & Attention: Look for the Gifts Already Given, (Exploring Tools to Battle the Busyness of the Season) – What do many folks think about this time of year? Presents! We are going to begin the month practicing presence as a powerful spiritual practice for the month of "busy". We will be making snowflakes and playing games to see what it feels like to be in the moment.

December 8 – Presence & Gift Giving: Look for What You Love About Them, (Exploring Lessons in Gift Giving) – As we focus on Presence, we will explore the joys of gift giving. After our story, there will be several gifts that our children can choose to make and give this season. We will also be finalizing any bits needed for the RE holiday Sunday next week.

December 15 – The Present of Presence, Annual RE Holiday Service – The Summit children worked with Reverend KC and our DRE Mary to craft this special holiday service. We will be present together

We are a supportive circle of men who share and listen to each other. We invite vou to visit with us.




MEN'S DISCUSSION GROUP #2
