# KC's Korner ~ Reverend KC Marie Pandell

Dear Summitarians and Friends:

A few people have asked me over the last few weeks how we're supposed to deal with the constant barrage of bad news. My answer has been something of a deadpan response, where I shrug a little and say "Well. I inform myself as much as I can until my anxiety ramps up. Then I watch cute animal videos and snuggle my dogs."

This is not to sound flippant, or to trivialize real fears and uncertainties. Rather, I think it's important to contextualize and humanize our responses. Being informed is important and necessary work – we as Unitarian Universalists have a time-honored tradition of bearing witness, at the foundation of our faith. But there is also something to be said for caring for ourselves and our communities, and there's only so much witnessing we can do before we verge on burning out. There is only so much hot rage that can burn before we wither away.

As we see continued attacks on our fellow Americans, the dismantling of our systems that are meant to be lifelines for those in need, and unsubstantiated claim after unsubstantiated claim, there is always work to be done, and we know acts of resistance, such as economic blackouts and protests, have a place. We must also continue the work of rest and rejuvenation. We should be leaning into the simple acts of care and community:

- Sharing resources, such as food donations to Gizmo's Kitchen, or clothing donations to Naomi's Closet
- Getting engaged with local events,
   such as beach or park clean ups, food

banks, soup kitchens

 Donating our time, talent, or treasure where able – I'm a big fan of donating blood to the Red Cross, and do so regularly

Just to name a few. Even something as simple as checking in on each other and making the effort to be kind, generous, caring, and loving will go a long way to helping us all stay grounded, centered in love, and ready to take on a new day.

There are very real, very concerning things happening in the world, and in our country, and yet, there is beauty, joy, and love that cannot and will not be destroyed. May we all find our ways towards building communities of love and resilience and share them joyfully with one another. May we all find our way to the homes and communities we are bolstered and held by in care.



# LIFESPAN FAITH FORMATION NEWS MARY CARTER-VAIL. DIRECTOR OF RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION

Spring is always one of my favorite times of the year to be in San Diego. The hills are just starting to green up as the seeds, hydrated by our recent

rains, spring to life. Birds are gathering nesting materials in my back yard and the hummingbirds are eagerly waiting for me to fill the feeders. I breath in the warming air and trust in the natural cycles that are occurring all around me at this time.

Trust: Our theme for this month is <u>Living Love</u> through the <u>Practice of Trust</u>. This month we will play with the theme by exploring ways to build trust with ourselves, others, and ways to repair trust when an "oops!" happens. At the end of the month, we have a special project for the community to participate in for Transgender Day of Remembrance. We will be making cards to send to Point of Pride to be included with care packets for the transgender community.

Your Spiritual Practice of trust: How is this a powerful spiritual practice for you? How do you lean into trusting yourself? How does it feel to trust others or a group? What ways do you engage in repair when trust is broken? Is trust difficult or easy for you? Why?

Soul Work: Our Soul Work table will continue to be part of the cozy corner in the Sanctuary. If you have an idea to share, let Mary know so we can expand some of the activities on the table. Meanwhile, there is always something available to work with during the service. Take something to your seat as you listen to the service. The Soul Work Table and Cozy Corner are for all ages so please enjoy!

Join us for All Ages Faith Formation at Summit: VOLUNTEERS NEEDED! We are growing our Religious Exploration program and expanding to an all-ages Faith Formation program. Join us and consider being part of this important part of our congregational life. (Volunteers who work with children will need to be background checked and take Mandated Reporter training.) #### Our March Theme is the Practice of Trust:

We will be gathering in RE at 10 am on Sundays for our Religious Exploration activities. Our children and youth will participate in the service until after the "Time for All Ages" story. We will then split into age centered groups to engage in our activities in the Religious Exploration area and/or outside (depending on weather conditions). After the service, we will be joining our families in the Salon for sustenance & community social time. Nursery childcare will be available until 12 noon.

March 2 – Trust is Like a Seed – Trusting Ourselves & Garden Planting – We begin this month by exploring ways to trust starting small with seeds and baby plants in the Summit Children's Garden. A seed contains all the genetic "magic" needed to become a whole plant that we can eat and share. As we connect with nature and nurture seeds, plants, soil and the garden critters, we are building trust with each other and the natural world. We will be preparing and planting our spring garden together. Our garden is a way of inviting and including our neighbors as well, building community care and trust.

March 9 – Trusting Others— As we continue to explore the spiritual practice of Trust, we will be checking our garden to see what has sprouted and what is still waiting below the ground. We then have group games to foster trust in each other to play together and build our connections.

March 16 – Trusting Life – This week we will be exploring ways in which we trust things to work out. We will be taking a "leap of faith" together by jumping over pillows and playing other games. We will also use our artistic side to use watercolors to paint ways that we trust life while using the Summit gardens as inspiration.

March 23 - Fixing Broken Trust – This week, we look at what it takes to fix broken trust. In addition to discussing the skills of making a sincere apology and forgiveness, we will also get into feelings and explore how it feels when people lie to us or don't keep things private. We will be making marshmallow bridges, calm down kits and explore ways to engage in repairs when trust is broken. Parents are welcome to attend as well.

#### March 30 - Trusting Our Inherent Worth: Transgender Day of Visibility Faith in Action

**Project** – In this final week, we look at trusting our inherent worth and how part of that is also about helping others trust *their* inherent worth. This will lead us into how we can support those voices in each other's heads that says, "I deserve to be treated with respect." With this as our focus, we have the wonderful opportunity to honor Transgender Day of Visibility with a Faith in Action project. We will be making cards that will be

discretely mailed by <u>Point of Pride</u> alongside support packages to trans people with barriers in accessing healthcare.

These are the plans at the beginning of the month, and they may be adapted as our community needs adapt, so please watch the weekly Children's Religious Exploration Email. To receive the weekly email, send your email address to Mary at summitdre@gmail.com.


