This month we are paying attention to our garden at Summit. The baby seedlings are growing into young plants with water from all the rain and the

compost we added to the soil nurturing them to become food for us all. Our congregation is also a place of growth and for nurturing each other as we pay attention to being in community together.

Paying Attention: I remember hearing “Pay Attention!” from teachers in school many times as a child. I tended to daydream and create stories in my mind when I lost my focus on the lesson. Why is Paying Attention our theme for this month? Rather than ignoring our inner wonder and curiosity, what would it be like to pay attention to that inner voice? What about paying attention to the moment as it is happening rather than thinking about what is next or what was in the past? How about paying attention to the blessing of clean water each day? Or the impact we have on each other? We will be exploring these ideas and more this month as we engage with this theme in our Religious Exploration program. Let us all pay attention as we aspire to bring much needed love and joy to each other and the world.

Free Little Library is OPEN! – Thank you to all who have brought books to contribute. Our little library is getting some local attention, and we are being added to the Little Free Library App. We do need some more books so bring in any gently used titles to contribute. Bring book donations to RE so our children can add in the bookplates and enjoy filling the library. Thanks again to all who have supported this fun project!

Join us for All Ages Faith Formation at Summit: VOLUNTEERS NEEDED! We are growing our Religious Exploration program and expanding to an all-ages Faith Formation program. Our March Theme is Paying Attention

We will be gathering in the Sanctuary at 10 am on Sundays for Religious Exploration. Our children and youth will participate in the service until after the “Invitation for All Ages” story. We will then split into age centered groups to engage in our activities in the Religious Exploration area and/or outside (depending on weather conditions). After the service, we will be joining our families in the Salon for sustenance & community social time. Nursery childcare will be available until 12 noon.

March 1 – The Power of Paying Attention to Our Impact on Others – We begin to explore our new theme by looking at how we impact others. We each have our own “Cup” of positivity or negativity that we bring along each day. What happens when our cup spills? How does this impact our family, friends, community, etc.? We will be decorating our own cups as we play with paying attention to our impact on others.

March 8 – The Power of Paying Attention to Inequality – This week we be seeing if we can use our skills of “Paying Attention” as a way to notice inequality. We will be exploring the UU value of equity as we learn stories of UU women who overcame unequal challenges in education and leadership. What is the difference between equality and equity? Join us as we discover the answer together through games and activities.

March 15 - The Power of Paying Attention to the Present Moment – Sometimes it is hard to pay attention to the moment we are in. This week we will be making mindful stones and learning bubble breathing as we practice being in the moment. Rather than thinking about yesterday or worrying about tomorrow, we will be in the now. Being together at this time is a gift. That’s why it is called the present

March 22 – The Power of Paying Attention To Our Relationship with Water – Our bodies need water every day to live. Our connection with water reminds us of our connection to each other and our beautiful planet, Earth. Today we will be “Paying Attention” to water thru art, making lemonade and making our own filter to clean muddy water.

This Sunday we will be listening to our bodies and our hearts to discover our inner wisdom. Come play games and make art as we pay attention to our inner knowing.

Hello Summit friends,

It feels good to be with you again as we enter a new month together. Lately, I've been reflecting on our March theme of *Paying Attention*, and how much intention that simple phrase holds. A colleague recently shared with me how easy it is, especially in difficult times, to focus only on what is frightening or disheartening in the world. There is certainly no shortage of that. But attention is powerful. Our attention is so valuable, in fact, that entire industries compete for it.

That alone tells us something about its worth.

So what happens when we choose, gently and deliberately, where to place it?

In my own life, paying attention sometimes looks very small. It looks like making time for coffee with friends and putting our phones away so we can truly see one another. It looks like noticing when a melody softens a room, or when a shared breath before a hymn gathers us into the same moment. Music, at its best, teaches us how to be here. A choir piece asks us to listen as closely as we sing. A hymn centers us not only in harmony, but in presence. Song draws our attention not just to itself, but to the stories, people, and hopes it carries.

March offers us particular chances to practice this kind of attention. On International Women's Day, we listen for the voices of women who have long carried wisdom, courage, and song into the world, and for those still finding their way forward. At Ostara, the earth itself teaches us to listen as light slowly lengthens its song. And for those observing Lent, this season opens space for a quieter rhythm, one that asks us to notice what is most honest and most needed.

As I prepare music for us this month, I find myself asking not only what we will sing, but what we will notice together. Where is courage already humming among us? Where is hope waiting to be heard? Where might our attention itself become an act of care?

I'm grateful to practice that kind of listening with you, and to keep singing side by side.
